Jobs for the Autumn

- ~Divide established rhubarb crowns to create new plants
- ~Plant out spring cabbages
- ~Harvest apples, pears, grapes and nuts
- ~Prune climbing roses
- ~Finish collecting seeds from the garden to sow next year
- ~Last chance to mow lawns and trim hedges in mild areas
- ~Renovate old lawns or create new grass areas by laying turf
- ~Move tender plants, including aquatic ones, Into a greenhouse or conservatory
- ~Divide herbaceous perennials
- ~ Cut back perennials that have died down
- ~ Plant Winter garlic
- ~ Plant out Spring bulbs in pots, the lawn and Borders


KHS Charity Event October 9th

RECIPE IDEAS for you to try

Borscht (serves 6)

1 onion
450/1 lb raw beetroot peeled
2 celery sticks
1/2 red pepper
115/4 oz mushrooms
1 large cooking apple
25g/1 oz butter
30 ml/2 tbs butter
30 ml/2 tbs sunflower oil
2 litres/3 1/2 pts stock or water
1 tsp cumin seeds
Pinch thyme
1 large bay leaf
Fresh lemon juice

Chop all veges, place in large saucepan with butter, oil and 3 tbs of the stock or water. Cover and cook gently for about 15 minutes. Stir in cumin seeds and add remaining stock or water, thyme, bayleaf, lemon juice and seasoning to taste. Bring mixture to the boil, cover and simmer

for about 30 minutes.

Strain vegs and blend until smooth and creamy,

Return vegetables to the pan, add reserved stock and reheat.

Serve with swirls of soured cream



A Tribute to Neil Philpott 6.2.32—9.10.21

A very proud Lancastrian, born in Southport in 1932 whose interest in horticulture started from a very early age when he collected exotic cacti.

At 16 years old he was accepted on a 4 year apprenticeship with the Liverpool Parks City Parks Department then went on to Study for 3 years at The Edinburgh Royal Botanic Gardens, riding to his digs through wind and rain on his motor bike to gain his Diploma in Horticulture.

He went on to study for a year at the Park Administration College on the banks of the Thames near Reading.

His extensive career includes;

Evening lecturer on horticulture and botany, Morley College, London. Landscape designer and contracts manager for Middlesex County Council. Horticultural officer – London County Council, which became the GLC. Arboriculture Officer, with responsibility for all matters concerning trees and woodlands under the control of the GLC and then the ILEA (Inner London Education Authority). This included tree preservation and conservation areas. Responsible for a large team of tree pruners during the big storm of

'87. He was a Judge for Britain in Bloom English and National competitions, for the British Tourist Authority.

Neil was Chairman of the Kingston upon Thames Society for 11 years. Following on from Jenny Philpott, became the President of the Kingston Horticultural Society, in 2007.

KHS was far more than a hobby for Neil, it became a huge part of his life. It was an outlet for his passion of trees and all things horticultural, but more importantly it is where he gained the friendship, love and support of his dear friends and Wednesday workers. The family want to thank everyone at KHS for that.
